AID RELIEF

- During the recent floods in Malaysia, the donation box collections were utilised to help affected school children in the East Coast, through a joint fundraising effort between McDonald's and RMHC
- McDonald's matched ringgit for ringgit the collections in the RMHC donation boxes for the month of January and February 2015, which led to RM425,000 being raised for this flood relief effort
- RMHC has also provided aid to orphanages and homes for the underprivileged and such, including those that have been badly affected by natural disasters



RMH-PPUKM

Ronald McDonald House (RMH) is a home away from home for paediatric patients and their families, which enables them to find support from other families in similar situations. Situated within the grounds of Pusat Perubatan Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (PPUKM), more than 600 families have benefited from this facility, costing some RM4.5 million in running costs over the years.



Ronald McDonald "Gift of Smile"

Over 350 children with cleft lip and cleft palate have received corrective treatments at no charge since the launch of this programme 11 years ago. Although this birth defect is not life-threatening, if left untreated, a child with this condition will lack confidence, which will further decline as he or she develops slurred speech and communication problems. Ronald McDonald Sensory Room

The sensory room aids children with delayed mental development where special multi-sensory equipment stimulates the five senses of sight, hearing, touch, smell and taste, along with balance and movement. To date, there are 21 Ronald McDonald Sensory Rooms across Malaysia and this number will continue to grow in the years ahead.



Ronald McDonald Scholarship

Every year, RMHC selects over 80 secondary school children from low income families who have excellent academic results and are active in school for its scholarship programme. Carried out with the cooperation of the Ministry of Education, the students receive monetary support throughout their secondary education. To date, more than 500 students have benefited from this programme.
